

Code of Conduct

Everyone at the school has the following rights:

- To be listened to
- To be treated with respect
- To work in a clean tidy and safe environment
- To have help sorting out problems
- To have possessions treated with care.

We have agreed to behave towards each other in the following ways:

- Let others have their say, show tolerance and respond in the right way
- Show kindness, consideration, politeness, courtesy and helpfulness to all
- Keep the school clean and tidy
- Move around the school quietly without running or pushing
- Ask someone for help when there is a problem
- Take care of everything in and around the school

This code of conduct has been agreed by all

School Rules

Staff should note and apply the following school rules:

- Arrive at lessons on time.
- Hats and coats will be taken off in the classrooms, dining room or corridors.
- Pupils must walk in corridors.
- Pupils must not use the staff corridors.
- Bullying will not be tolerated.
- Pupils must not bring items of value into school.
- Water may be drunk in lessons.
- Packed lunches should be eaten in the dining room.
- Correct school uniform (including P.E. kit) must be worn at all times unless specifically stated for Curriculum days.
- Jewellery should not be worn, apart from a wrist watch and one stud in each ear which must be removed for PE.
- Make-up is not allowed
- No inappropriate physical contact.
- Dangerous items are not allowed in school.
- Any music players used on transport must be handed in to the Family Group Tutor for safe keeping.
- Mobile phones are **not** allowed in school under any circumstances.
- All music devices that can also take photographs are **not** allowed in school.

School Rules

There are a number of serious incidents for which students may receive fixed term (internally or externally), or permanent exclusions by the Headteacher.

These include:-

- Verbal or physical abuse directed towards a member of staff or pupil.
- Leaving the school site without permission.
- Smoking or possession of cigarettes, alcohol or dangerous items.
- Taking or possession of non prescription drugs.
- Non- accidental damage to property. Parents will be asked to make a contribution to the cost of repair or replacement.
- Persistent/ serious defiance.
